

JANUARY



January is the first month of the year.

It is named after the Roman God Janus, who stands for new beginnings

**A full moon in January is called
the Wolf Moon**

January has 31 days

FEBRUARY



February is the second month of the year.

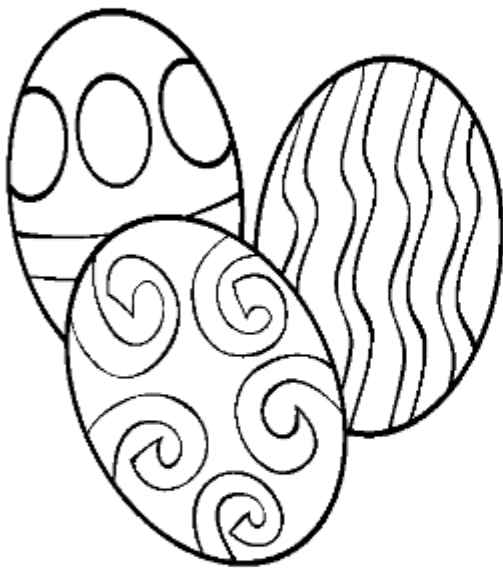
It's named after the Februa ritual that the Romans held each year.

February 2nd is Candlemas or Imbolc.
A day to celebrate the first signs of spring!

**A Full moon in February is called
the Snow Moon**

February has 28 days

MARCH



March is the third month of the year.

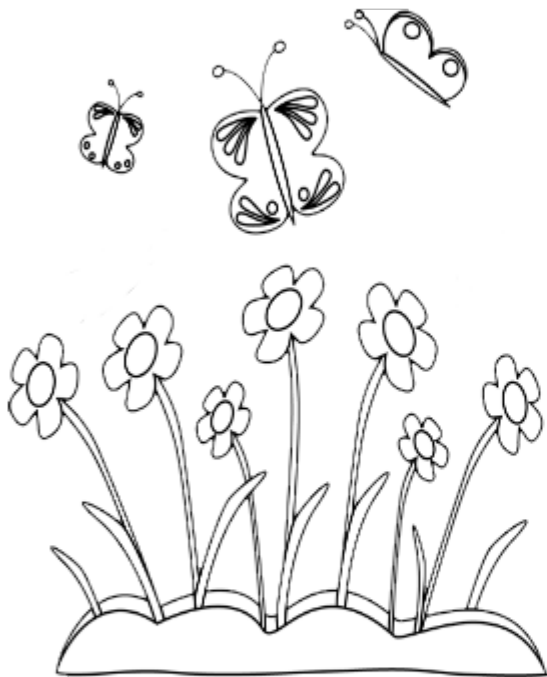
It's named after the Roman God Mars, who watched over farming.

The spring equinox is around March 21st, when day and night are the same length.

**A Full moon in March is called
the Worm Moon**

March has 31 days

APRIL



April is the fourth month of the year.

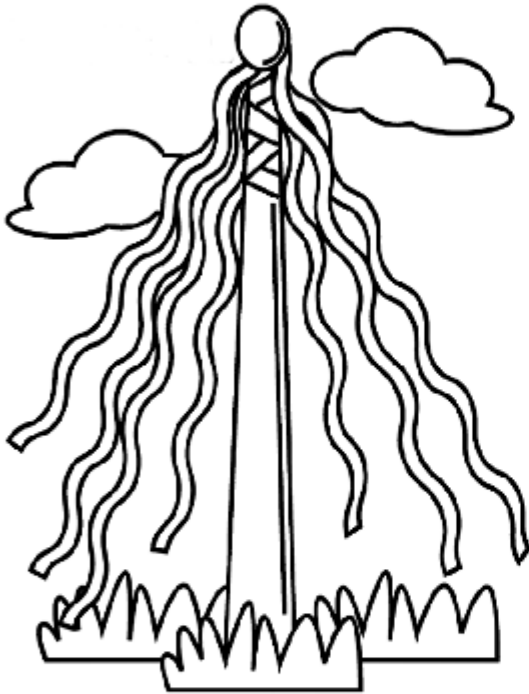
It's named for the latin word aperire, which means to open (like the new flowers of spring)

April 22nd is Earth day, to honor the environment!

**A Full moon in April is called
the Pink Moon**

April has 30 days

MAY



May is the fifth month of the year.

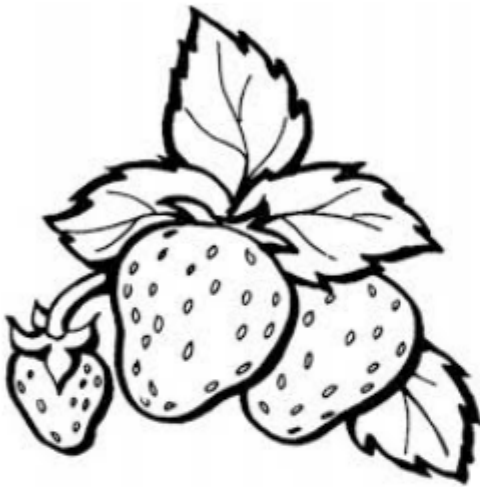
It's named after the Roman Goddess Maia, who ruled over growth and family.

May 1st is Beltane, when we dance the maypole

**A Full moon in May is called
the Flower Moon**

May has 31 days

JUNE



June is the sixth month of the year.

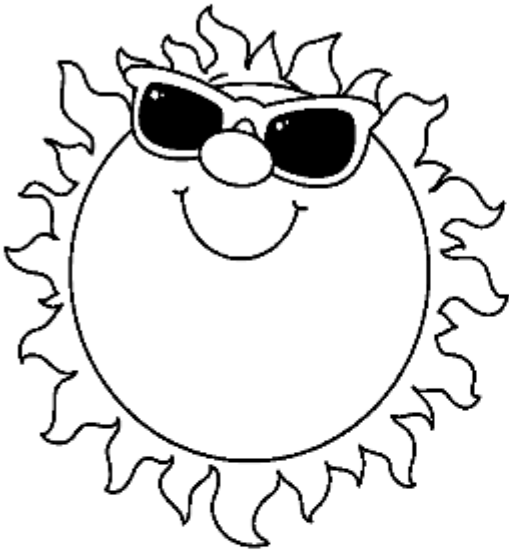
It's named after Juno, the Roman Goddess of marriage.

Summer solstice is around June 21st, the longest day of the year!

**A full moon in June is called
the Strawberry Moon**

June has 30 days

JULY



July is the seventh month of the year.

It is named after Julius Caesar, ruler of the Roman Empire.

**A Full moon in July is called
the Buck Moon**

July has 31 days

AUGUST

August is the eighth month of the year.



It's named after Roman Emperor Augustus.

August 1st is Lammas,
the first harvest festival
of the year

**A full moon in August is called
the Sturgeon Moon**

August has 31 days

SEPTEMBER



September is the ninth month of the year

"Sept" is latin for seven, as this used to be the seventh month in the calendar.

The fall equinox is around September 21st, when day and night are the same length

**A Full moon in September
is called a Corn Moon**

September has 30 days

OCTOBER



October is the tenth month of the year.

"Oct" is latin for eight, as this used to be the eighth month of the calendar.

October 31st is Samhain, the day to honor the dead

**A full moon in October is called
the Hunter's Moon**

October has 31 days

NOVEMBER



November is the eleventh month of the year.

"Nov" is latin for nine, as this used to be the ninth month of the calendar.

A Full moon in November is called the Beaver Moon

November has 30 days

DECEMBER



December is the twelfth month of the year.

"Dec" is latin for ten, as this used to be the tenth month of the calendar

Winter solstice is around December 21st, the longest night of the year

A Full moon in December is called the Cold Moon

December has 31 days
