

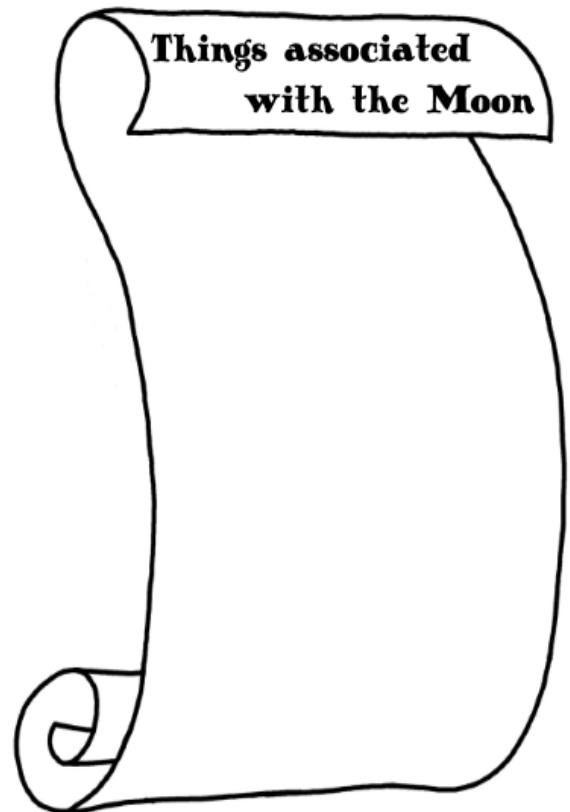
These pages contain all the pieces you need to make a lapbook on the Moon, aimed at elementary school kids I suppose. You'll likely need a book on astronomy for a few of the pieces but no difficult research should be required.

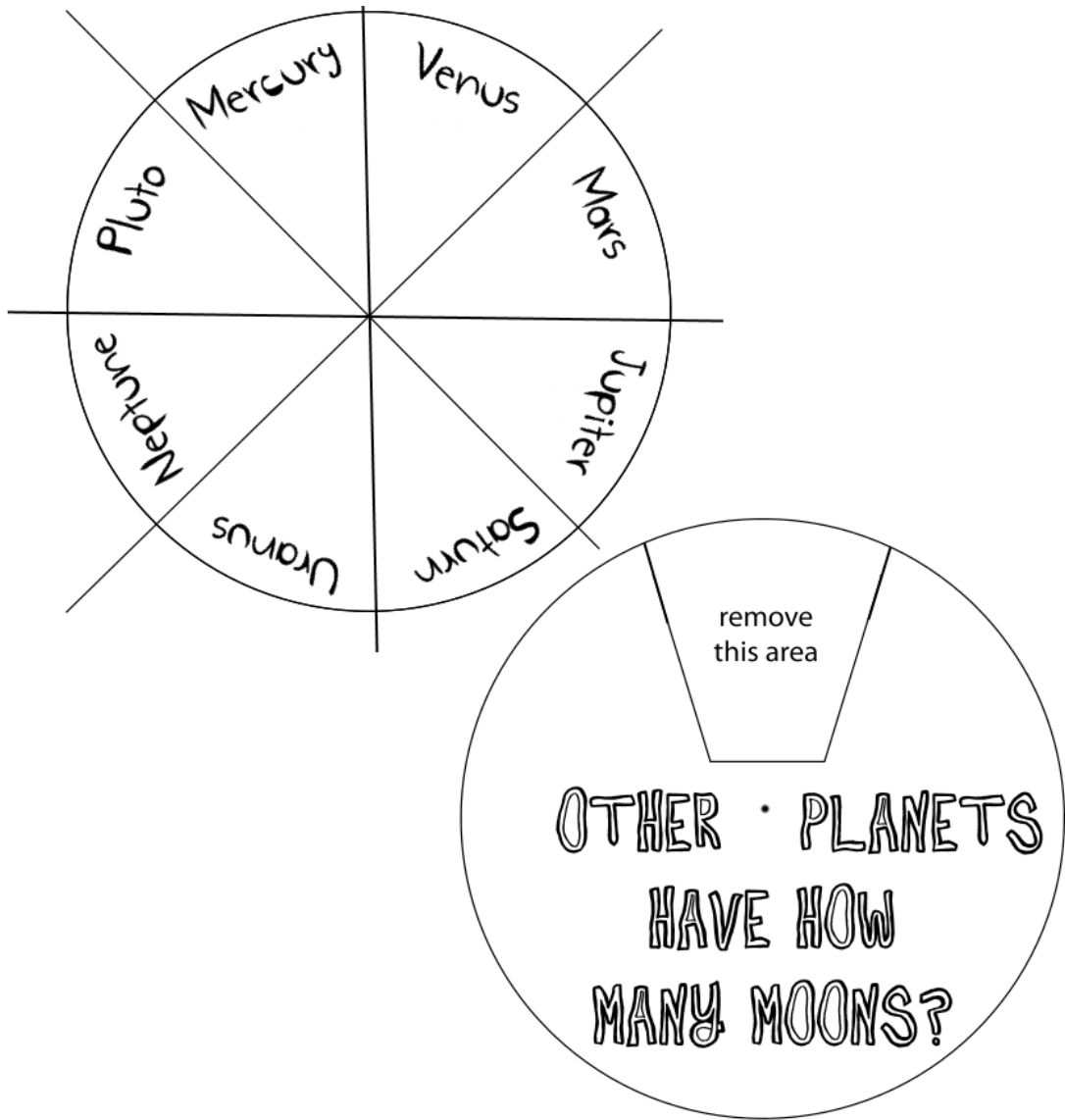
Basically, all the components can be cut out along their borders, with the dotted lines indicated folds. Use a standard office folder to create a portfolio, and glue all the pieces inside.

There are photos at the end that should show how all the booklets look after folding. You can get as creative as you want to arrange all the bits and pieces. There should be room for everything.

The folded pieces open up and information is written in the blank spaces by the person making the book (either you or your child).

Overall, this project contains a map of the moon's features to label, a chart showing the moon phases, a fold-out featuring 7 lunar Deities, a piece where you can list moon correspondences, a fold-out piece where you list the types of spells done at each moon phases, and a couple more question/answer flap bits. Oh, and a spiny thing showing the number of moons other planets have.






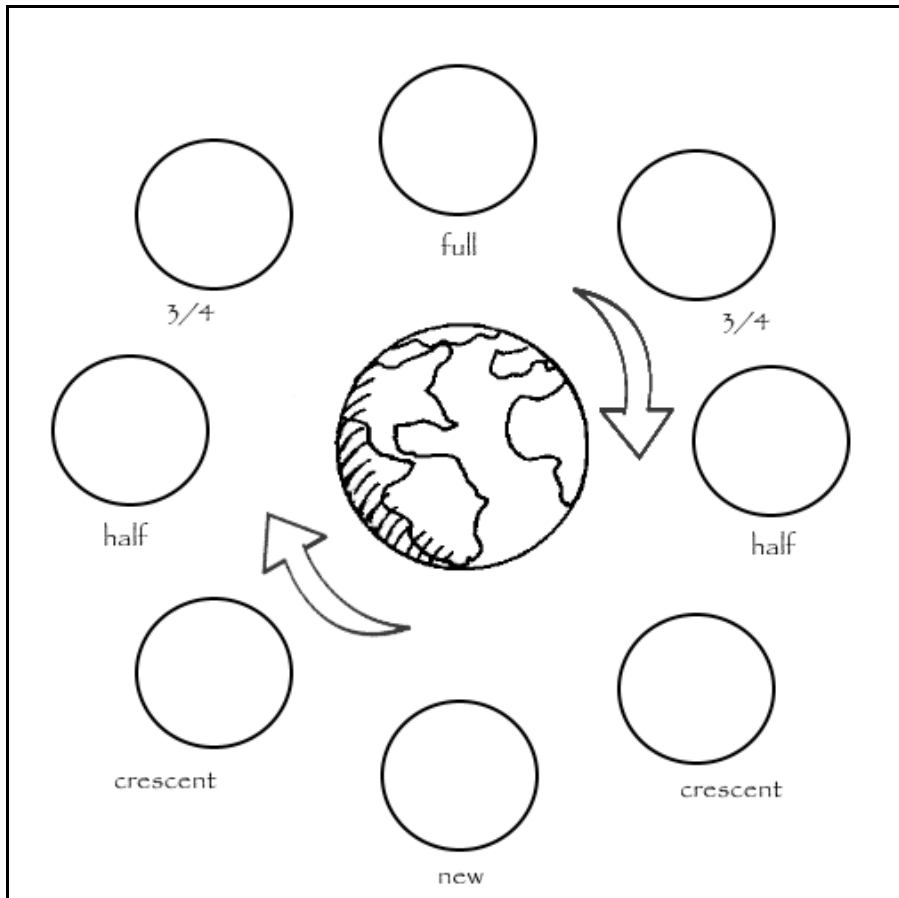
Use a brad through the dot in the cover piece to create a spinning dial movement.

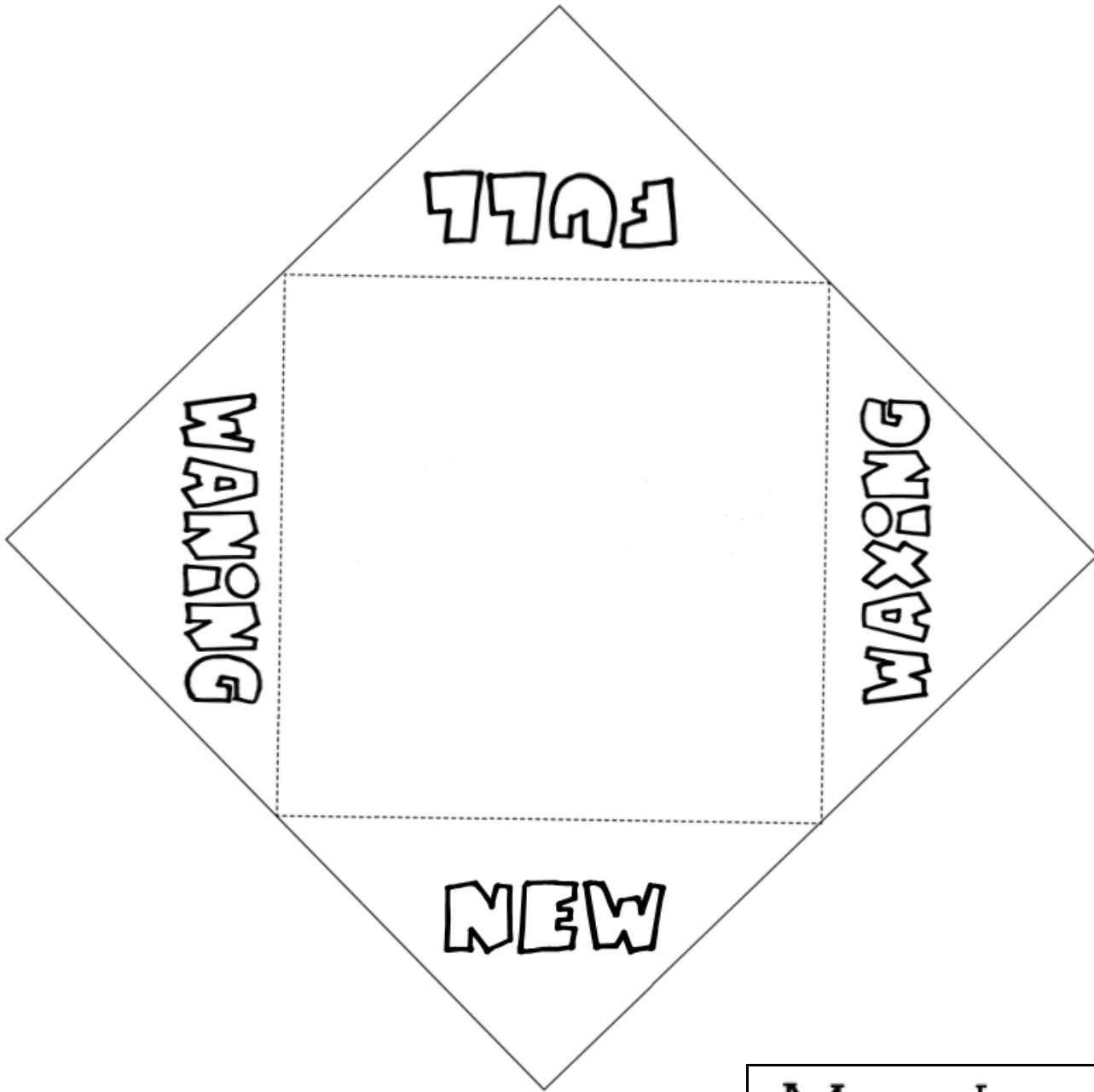

Draw in what each phase looks like

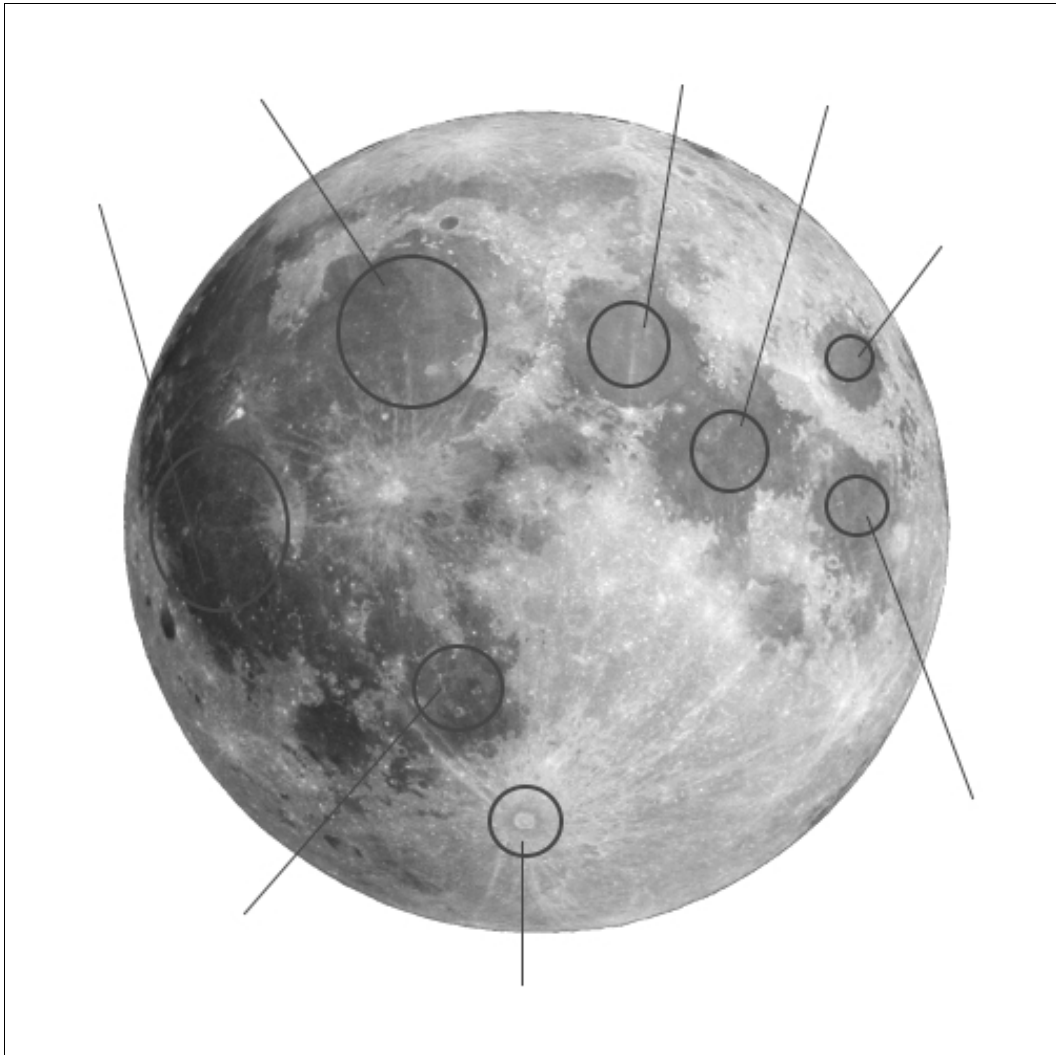
*Why do we only ever see one side of the moon?*
